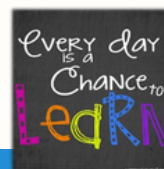

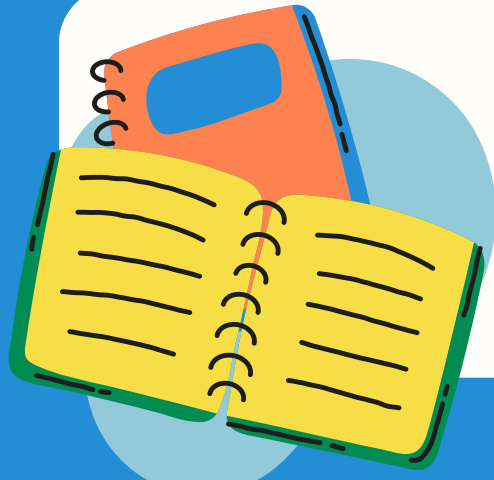

Beginning and end of the school day.

Please remember school begins at 8.45 am. This is when children begin their learning. Please be on time. The classroom doors will then be shut and the playground gate locked at 8.55 am. This is to safeguard all our children.

Pick up is at 3.15 pm from the classroom door.

If someone else is picking up, please inform the class teacher on the door in the morning or the school office during the day. If it is someone not known to us, you will be asked to set up a password so the teacher on the door knows that this is the agreed pick up. We will not let children go with an unknown adult or with a known adult without prior knowledge of the arrangement. This is of course to safeguard our children.

We are a mobile free zone. We would appreciate all phones to be switched off or put away on the playground. Please greet your child with a smile and not your phone. We know from many years experience that asking how their day was or asking what they did today, is usually met with Ok, I don't know or similar. At the end of the day we have a Five to Flourish discussion when we ask them to think of things they are proud of, they have learned, something that links to our values of embracing hope, building resilience, developing wisdom and choosing service. This may help you have a more productive conversation.

I love to share books in our learning that inspire thoughtful conversations.

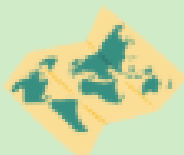

Our focus in term 1 will be on Psalm 1:3 and what that means to us at Kingfisher. We will also be learning about all four of our values and how they align with this Psalm.

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Reading



We are committed as a school to ensuring all children develop the skills they need to read independently and have access to life long learning.

Our team believe in ensuring all children find themselves represented in books. We aim to expose our children to high quality, award winning and diverse literature. Our Class names are chosen carefully to represent a diverse range of authors and to build your child's library at home as the progress through Kingfisher.

Book change days

MONDAY - Your child will bring home a sharing book which they choose from our class libraries. Every **Monday** one child in each class will also bring home the Book Club Scrapbook, they can use this to choose a book they would like to recommend, draw a picture of the front cover, write about why they recommend it etc. This will then be shared in Book Club the following Monday before someone else will take it home.

THURSDAY - Your child will bring home either a Little Wandle Reading book every **Thursday**, phonically matched to their phonic ability after they have read it three times in class., or a free reading book.

Please ensure both books are in your child's book bags for **Monday** to be collected in.

Phonics



We will continue learning phonics using Little Wandle which is the phonics and reading scheme at Kingfisher. Children are assessed every six weeks and this is used to ensure they are taught what they need next. This means there are different groups across the Key Stage. Most children will start by consolidating their Phase 5 graphemes, decodeable words and tricky words before moving onto learning Year 2 Spelling patterns. As always we assess to see what each child needs and plan to teach those steps.

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Phonics vs sharing books

Your child will bring home a book for pleasure on a **Monday** which you can share together. Do not worry if they cannot read this independently, it will not be phonically matched but is their choice and is to foster reading for pleasure. There is a lot of research that shows the importance of sharing books and bonding. Enjoy it! They will also bring home a book matched to their phonics ability on a **Thursday**. They will have read this in Reading Practice groups so should be able to read it fairly fluently - this is a great opportunity for them to show off their progress to you.

There are questions in the back of the book that you can discuss with them too.

How you can help at home

Ask children to spot the digraphs in a word.

If they ask how to spell a word ask them what phoneme they can hear first, next etc and ask them to write a grapheme for each phoneme.

Ask your child about the books they are reading, read with them, let them see you reading.

Christian Authenticity



In Collective Worship...



In our Values assembly on Mondays, we will be learning about psalm 1:3 and think about how our values are reflected in this and what this means for us as Christians. We always start by welcoming God, then we listen and respond before singing and having a reflection.

On Tuesday we have a assembly with our Chaplain, Owen, in our Chapel. He uses a resource that has been especially written for KSI and is the next in the series from Jack in the Box which they loved in Reception. Each assembly follows the familiar pattern: Welcome, Learn, Reflect, Respond and as Oscar the Owl 'flies' out of the box he invites children to become involved in each part of the worship journey.

On Wednesday we have a Class Worship – following the same pattern linking a bible story to the book/story from Monday's assembly.

Thursday is a Singing Assembly, learning and worshipping through song, as well as learning songs for events and performances.

Our Friday Celebration Assembly celebrates the learning both inside and outside of school. It's a time for recognition and celebration of our brilliant Kingfishers.



We are maintaining our relationships with the community at the Child of Hope school in Uganda. We have our Child of Hope visit from Lucy Swift this term.

Each class will write letters to the children in their matching age class. We are sending them a book of our class author, lots of reading books and our class photo.

We are looking forward to receiving letters back from our class friends in Uganda.

Later on in the Year we will have a day of activities to grow our links further.
